## OUT WITH THE OLD...

A vessel that had been in service for over 30 years was replaced by a shiny new tower.

Our team has been involved with multiple large turnarounds and capital projects at refineries. One notable project involved the storage, transport and placement of over 120 vessels, modules and other major components at a refinery. Some of the heavier picks weighed 160,000 lbs. and required our 500, 600, and 900 ton cranes.

Our cranes and crew were responsible for each and every pick throughout the turnaround. The entire two-year project was performed without injury or damage to equipment. A core crew of operators were involved in this turnaround from day one. Many thanks to their attention to detail and their commitment to safety.

# Transporting and setting the tower



## UTILIZING THE SPMT GOLDHOFER

Mountain was tasked with transporting a 129' vessel weighing over 140k pounds through a refinery. The transport involved extremely tight space constraints and very tight cornering. Multiple route surveys were performed prior to the transport and a team of four spotters along with the operator were used to move the vessel to the cranes for final set. A six-line self-propelled E-steer Goldhofer was used to push the vessel with a light weight four axle steerable dolly on the front end for steering. The self-propelled trailer was the right tool and made one critical 3 point turn a breeze. The Goldhofer PSTE was fitted with rocking turn tables that allowed the vessel to travel over multiple elevation changes throughout the refinery without creating any undue stress



on the vessel during transport. The vessel was delivered to 600 ton and 350-ton hydraulic cranes for standing and final set to foundation. The transport, although short, was highly technical and involved extensive planning and was executed flawlessly.



We are incredibly proud of all those involved in the success of this project.
