Setting a 60,000 Pound Drum

Recently our crane and heavy haul teams worked together to transport and set a massive 60,000 lb. drum into Great Salt Lake Minerals.

The preliminary work involved several weeks of engineering, permitting, widening a road, and planning for safely working around overhead power lines. The on-site work included our Osh Kosh M1070 Tugger and six lines of Goldhofer modular platform trailer pulling the drum into the facility. With a width of 22' and height of 29' our 550t crane was needed along the route to hoist the drum over a pipe rack running right through its path. After setting the drum back on the Goldhofer, the transport team changed from a pulling configuration to a pushing configuration which allowed the steerable trailer to set the vessel on the cement pad adjacent to the crane. The drum was then offloaded by our 550 ton crane and set safely in place. Congratulations to our engineering team, Mountain Heavy Transport, and our crane crew for a job well done!


