Home Depot Day




Mountain Crane Service recently participated in Home Depot Day. This family-oriented event is a chance for children to explore many different types of machines and vehicles used in construction.


A Short History Lesson and a Letter of Appreciation



In 2006 Mountain Crane had been in business for a short two years and owned approximately 15 truck cranes and one tired Manitowoc M250. The company focused primarily on local taxi-crane service in the Salt Lake City region. At the time, the worldwide headquarters of the company was a tired little mobile construction office trailer located on two rented acres. Brian Wenneshiemer and his wife travelled from Michigan to that tired little office where he was presented with an opportunity to become a fifth partner in Mountain Crane. In exchange, the owners asked Brian to turn his family's living situation upside down by quitting a very stable and profitable job in his home state of Michigan, to join a small company with a short two years history, a broken RT990, and the hair brained idea to buy a Manitowoc 1600. At the time, the four partners had no clear plan for financing the

16000 or where they would put the crane to work. The owners believe that as partners they could accomplish the unrealistic goal of building a national crane rental company from the ragged construction trailer and a "on order" 16000. As Brian's partners we are and will always be grateful that he was willing to put his family's well-being on the line and dared to believe in four lost souls with little cash and lofty goals.

While the new owners struggled to finance that first 16000 crane, it was Brian who secured a one-year contract for the crane that made the financing possible. That crane delivered straight to the job site in 2007 for its first one-year contract. Five years later that same crane has missed only one



month of rental. Those of you who understand the crane industry, know how amazing that statement is. To understand the rest of the story, all you need to do is look at the map on Mountain Cranes' website. The many cranes on that map outside of the Intermountain Region are the fruits of Brian's Amazing efforts to build a National Crane Rental company. In the five years, Mountain Crane has added additional partners and transformed into an industry leader with nearly 85 cranes and more than 100 employees. Growth and size, however are no excuse for failing to recognize and honor the company's roots.

Brian, for all intents and proposes, is one of the founding members of Mountain Crane Service. Mountain Crane is the company it is today because of the belief and hard work of the original five partners who dared to try things that the world said they could not do. Mountain Crane would like to take this opportunity to thank its over worked and underappreciated partner and his family for all of their faith and efforts.
