Washed Out Bridges



Mountain Crane's Demag AC140 170 Ton All Terrain was recently involved in several different projects up in the mountains. At Smith & Morehouse National Forest, a bridge to Ledgefork Campground had been washed out and had blocked off access to 37 camp sites. Federal funds paid to replace the bridge. In order to get to the site, Mountain Crane had to cross 2 bridges that were not able to hold up the weight of a crane so "temporary" bridges were built out of inserts from our cozad trailer and put into place to transport the crane to the desired location.


