As seen below, this project involved two of Mountain's LTM 1400 500-Ton Liebherr All Terrain Cranes working together to assemble and disassemble wind blades on each turbine.

Maintenance on these towering windmills is not an easy task and Mountain Crane is proud of its operators as well as the collaboration from Siemens that help make these projects run safely and efficiently.
