Shark Tunnel Project

Mountain Crane Service has been working with several contractors to help build the new Living Planet Aquarium in Draper, Utah. One of the new exciting features of this aquarium will be a shark tank where visitors will be able to walk under and watch these creatures swim above them. Mountain Crane's Grove GMK 5275 All Terrain Crane installed this 40 ft. long, 26,000 lbs. 6.5 inch thick acrylic tunnel into place.







This lift required intense precision as there was about a 1-inch clearance on both sides as they lifted the tunnel from the ground and into its proper position through the open ceiling into the aquarium.
