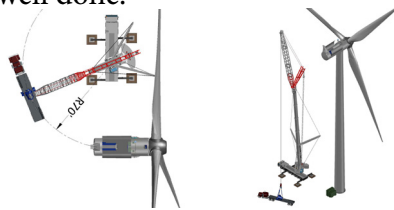

Mountain Crane is proud to be involved in many successful Windpower projects throughout the country and the scenery in Fort Dodge, Iowa certainly didn't disappoint. Surrounded by cornfields on the MidAmerica site we replaced a 50,000 lb. gearbox on a Siemens 2.3 megawatt turbine sitting on an 80 meter tower.

Using our Liebherr LTM 1400-7.1 hydraulic all terrain crane with a boom configuration of 152 ft main boom & 138 ft luffing jib with superlift and 225,500 lb. of counterweight we were able to finish the project in 5 days often working late at night to catch a break in the wind. Time is of the essence when completing a project like this and we are proud of the crew for a job well done.

On Friday, September 11, the Fort Douglas Museum, located in Salt Lake City, Utah, is hosting a ceremony remembering the 2,996 that died fourteen years ago, and to honor those who have fought for our freedom since.

The Utah Fallen Warrior Memorial will be the backdrop, and a crowd is expected to include local military and first responders. The event is open to the public and all are welcome to attend. If you can't join us on September 11, the memorial can still be seen at the Fort Douglas Museum.
